Bernalillo County General Obligation Bonds

A bond represents a money borrowed by a government to finance capital improvement projects. The bonds are called general obligation (G0) bonds because payment of the debt (principal plus interest) is a general obligation of the governmental entity issuing the bond.

GO bonds are sold to bond investors, subject to voter approval of separate bond questions, as a way to generate revenue for capital projects. There are separate bond questions on the ballot for roads, drainage, utilities, buildings, public safety, community facilities, and libraries. GO bonds must be sold within a specific time after voter approval. They must be fully spent on capital (bricks and mortar) projects or equipment, not on daily operations or maintenance. Bond money cannot be transferred from one category to another.

Passage of the bonds will not increase property taxes.
